

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# Creating Character Empathy

Story beginnings can happen in many different ways, but there's one thing that is constant. And that's *EMPATHY*. Your first job in a romance novel should be to get the reader to care about your main characters.

There are three ways to establish empathy and make readers instantly get the feels for characters. You only need one... unless you're an overachiever ©

1. One way is to showcase the character's *EXTRAORDINARY QUALITIES*. Are they super smart like Sherlock Holmes? Or super techy like Maguyver?

2. Another way is to display the character's ordinariness in an *EXTRAORDINARY WORLD*. For example, are they the sole normie in a family of superheroes?

3. Finally, you can have them *SAVE THE CAT*. Metaphorically, speaking. Show them being of service or rescuing another person, like saving a cat after it climbs up into a tree.

# Directing Meet Cutes

The *Meet Cute* is the classic scene in a romantic movie or novel where two (or more) strangers cross paths for the first time on the page or screen. What makes this crucial scene memorable is where an author choses to set the meeting, the tropes that bring the lovers together, and whether the characters feel a mutual attraction, aversion, or something in between when they come center stage... or rather center page.

SETTING
PLACE
TIME PERIOD
TONE

The PLACE and the TIME PERIOD your romance novel takes occurs affects the TONE of the story. Each of the love stories below has the same structure, but the place and time period affect the tone of each story differently.

- *Pride and Prejudice* -Victorian Era. Small town England. Contemporary Romance with social commentary tone.
- *Twilight* -20th century. Small Town USA. Paranormal Romance with Suspense tone
- *Fifty Shades of Grey* -20th century. Big City USA. Coming of age sexual awakening, Erotic Romance tone.

A TROPE is a recurring theme or pattern in storytelling that helps create familiarity, convey expectations, and evoke emotions. In a romance novel, the trope is typically the reason the lovers are thrust together for the duration of the story. For example:

- Enemies to Lovers
- Marriage of Convenience
- Fake Dating

# Directing Meet Cutes

#### ATTRACTION

There are four types of connections or **ATTRACTION** in romance.

- Pull / Pull: the characters are instantly and mutually attracted to each other like in *Romeo and Juliet*.
- Push / Push: the characters are instantly and mutually disinterested in each other like in *When Harry Meet Sally*.
- Push / Pull: one character is instantly attracted but the other character is disinterested like in *The Notebook*.
- Neutral / Nervous: one character awkwardly tries to hide their attraction while the other character is oblivious to the situation like in *My Big Fat Greek Wedding*.

Which attraction do your characters initially feel?

There are four main **SITUATIONS** in which the meet cute can take place. Which one suites your lovers best?

•HEROIC: where one lover rescues the other from danger or a questionable situation. Think a superhero or military romance.

•EMBARRASSING: where one or both (or more) of the lovers find themselves in an uncomfortably cringeworthy situation. Think of just about any romcom.

•INSTALOVE: where one or bother (or more) of the lovers see forever when they spot the other. Think paranormal romance with wolf shifters or vampires.

•ADVERSARIAL: where they're at each others throats either immediately or for something that happened in their past.

# Planning Fun and Games

The FUN AND GAMES stage in a romance centers around the hero and heroine spending time with each other, getting to know one another, and developing feelings for one another. This "dating" section is often accompanied by lighthearted moments, flirting, and romantic displays of affection. It's an essential part of the story arc because it allows readers to observe the two falling in love and having a good time before the tests of the Dark Moment darken their day. Plan three dates for your lovers!

# Surviving the Dark Moment

The DARK MOMENT is a crucial scene in a romance novel where the hero and/or heroine face a major obstacle or challenge that threatens to tear or keep them apart. This moment typically occurs towards the end of the story, and creates a sense of tension and conflict that the hero and/or heroine must overcome in order to achieve their happy ending.

REVELATION of a deep secret or betrayal

MISUNDERSTANDING or miscommunication that creates a rift between the hero and heroine LIFE CHANGING EVENT that shakes up their world.

INTERNAL ISSUE like their own insecurities making them doubt themselves or the other person EXTERNAL FORCE, like an antagonist, physical obstruction, or mystic force, pushing them apart

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# Pulling off a Grand Gesture

A GRAND GESTURE in a romance is a dramatic action taken by one character to express their love or commitment to the other. It's not only a heartfelt declaration of love, it's often a sacrifice for the other person, or an act of bravery or forgiveness. It's intended to show how deeply they feel for their beloved and is often a call back to an earlier scene, likely in the Fun and Games.

#### PRIVATE DECLARATION

The gesture could be a simple declaration of love, especially if the hero isn't good at showing feelings. The I-Love-Yous should come from a genuine place of love and commitment, rather than being motivated by external factors or social pressure.

#### PUBLIC DECLARATION

The grand gesture is often a public act, meant to declare the hero or heroine's love to the world and show their commitment to their partner.

#### RESCUE

If one lover is in peril, then the other needs to rescue them at great danger to their own person.

#### PERSONALIZATION

The grand gesture should be tailored to the specific needs and desires of the hero or heroine, and reflect their unique relationship dynamic.

#### SACRIFICE

Similar to a rescue where the hero's life is in danger due to the action, they could willingly offer themselves in exchange for the heroine.



# Pulling off a Grand Gesture
